Resident complained to the Parish Council re: Pathfinder Walk and 'wandering walkers' and suggested that PC contact Pathfinder Walk and instruct them to put up more directional arrows through Kings Ripton.

190716/405	Speeding in the village: Traffic survey, report by Cllr D Sattelle Report attached. One of the items mentioned during Dave McCandless' presentation was the location of the 'Pedestrian in the road' sign which Dave McCandless advised PC to site on the verge near the allotments. <i>Note since meeting: Cllr KM took some photos of the part of Ramsey Road. Tthe photos are facing the north end of Ramsey Road, heading towards Wistow. The photos show the current siting of the sign, it is hard to spot on the bend in the distance in the photos, along with the Priority sign which Dave McCandless recommended to use to site the new sign the Roadwatch agreed to fund. The existing 'Pedestrian in the roads' sign is barely visible to oncoming traffic because of the bend in the road and does not allow enough time for traffic to slow down approaching the bridge and is actually sited after 2 of the 3 properties which exit on this bend.</i> PC agreed to seek CCC approval of siting of this additional 'Pedestrians in the road' sign. Clerk to email to Highways Officer Brian Murdoch. Regarding the purchase of the SID, Cllr DS agreed to complete the LHI application form for submission before the deadline 4 Aug 19. Traffic Surveys Kings Ripton

KRPC is indebted to David McCandless at Community Roadwatch (CRW) for all their efforts on our behalf. The regular reports and surveys both in the village, on the B1090 (at the crossroads and at a point between the crossroads and the A141) and on Sapley Way are very much appreciated and informative. They have been helpful when KRPC have been considering major nearby planning applications and in informing the case for a footbridge in the village to make it safer for walkers and those travelling on foot to the local Nursery, when crossing the road by the bridge.

Some of the main findings are as follows:

- Data show that speeding between and beyond the buildouts (designed to slow traffic) remains a problem but it is less of a problem now than prior to the installation of the buildouts.
- Uphill speeds across Quaker Close and downhill speeds from School Lane to the bridge are still a concern.
- Parking of vehicles adjacent to buildouts is a danger; visibility is affected and drivers are on the wrong side of the road for an extended period.
- Between Jan and May 2019, 10 sessions checking 2881 vehicles were undertaken in Kings Ripton and the results showed that 446 (15%) were above the speed limit with a highest speed of 52mph being recorded in the 30mph limit.
- There is a real concern regarding pedestrians crossing the road by the bridge to access public footpaths and the local Nursery.
- On the B1090 there is significant speeding – highest percentages of vehicles over the limit seem to be on weekends. Speeds up to 97mph were measured.

Some suggested CRW recommendations for KRPC to consider are:

- Continued support to CRW for offset the modest fuel costs and other reasonable costs to support those who give their time voluntarily to provide us with this useful information.
- Consideration of requesting double yellow lines beyond the buildouts to prevent visibility restrictions due to parked cars.
- Consideration of requesting moderate rise-tables or humps on the uphill and downhill areas referred to above to further limit speeds
- Consideration of changing the position of 'Pedestrians in Road' sign, which may be in the wrong place as it is only visible by downhill drivers after they begin to accelerate.

COMMUNITY ROADWATCH(UK) CIC

UPDATE FOR KINGS RIPTON PARISH 16 JULY 2019 BY MD, DAVID MCCANDLESS WWW.ROADWATCH.ORG.UK

In Feb 2015, Community Roadwatch (CRW) rose from the ashes of the district's very effective and far-reaching Speedwatch scheme that - after 4 years and 2000 sessions with 50 volunteers over 23 local villages generating up to 1000 letters to speeders per month in BST (when both ends of the day were in daylight) - collapsed in Nov 2014 after the area coordinator was suddenly unable to continue.

Kings Ripton's impressive Speedwatch Team's results – led by Gordon & Ros Townsend helped by others from Upwood and St Ives - are produced below and show that they were managing to keep speeding below 10% , but only just at the dangerous School Lane junction where, in the days of local Police enforcement , Andy Street used to catch them downhill at 40 mph:

The single objective of CRW's unpaid, volunteers, as ordinary members of the public, with 'special' kerbside skills, is simply to continue to help residents and parishes make their community roads as safe as they possibly can by whatever means remain lawfully open to them. In pursuit of that, and to allow them to apply for grants, the volunteers convinced the Government CIC Regulator to allow them to form a Community Interest Company with 5 Directors. Details at Companies House. As a CIC, the directors successfully applied for a Big Lottery Grant for a Speed Indicating Device (SID). Mick George also helped us out with 2 SIDs (one fixed in Colne Rd, Somersham) and with a Data Logger. We also had grants made from the Ramsey Grantscape Windfarm and the Red Tile Windfarm for a 2nd Logger and a 3rd SID respectively. All this kit is in continuous use to quantify (in the case of Loggers) or moderate (in the case of SIDs) and has been used extensively to map the volume/speeds along Ramsey Rd.
